



**Cemetery Trustees  
Meeting Minutes  
Saturday, April 23, 2017**

The Trustees of Town Cemeteries conducted on April 23, 2017 their annual spring tour of several Warner cemeteries. In attendance were Gerald and Penny Courser, Don Wheeler, and Mary and Ken Cogswell. The inspection began at 9 am and concluded around noon, with a visit to eight cemeteries.

The following is a brief list of the findings at each one :

1. New Waterloo - gate unlocked for the season
2. Old Waterloo - leaning oak tree inside NW side of cemetery will need a future estimate on eventual removal
3. Pine Grove - tall, cracked white pine on North edge of upper cemetery will require removal; previous estimate from Yankee Tree's Jeff Dearborn was approximately \$2,000
4. Lower Portion of Pine Grove - at least one grave site has overgrown ornamentals needing trimming
5. Lower Warner (AKA 'Mountain') - large, dead white pine on West end needs removal estimate
6. Davisville - discussed possible restoration and re-installation of old center gate (see February 15, 2017 Cemetery Trustee minutes regarding gate)
7. Poverty Plains - flagged with orange survey tape the approximate boundaries of this small, remote site at the request of the Warner Historical Society
8. Schoodac - discussed restoration proposed for grave stones damaged by large tree fall in cemetery's old section
9. Mason Hill - viewed excellent restoration work performed by Lane Monroe and Gary Young on several grave stones

Aside from the usual debris from tree twigs and fallen limbs, the cemeteries visited were in good shape following the winter.
