Dramatic increases in our electric rates are coming soon. On June 26th the PUC approved a 112 percent increase in power supply costs for Eversource Customers and we can expect more to come.

Would you like to spend less for electricity? Big corporations cut deals to lower their rates, and now, so can you. Buying electricity as a community-wide group or in collaboration with other towns is essentially how Community Power programs work.
